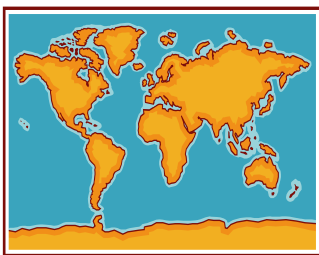
The World Affairs Council of Eastern North Carolina is the local chapter of the national World Affairs Council. WAC is a non-partisan, non-profit organization open to all.

WAC-ENC sponsors various programs to expand members' understanding of world affairs and the impact of U.S. foreign policy. Through lectures, discussions, and participation in international venues, WAC-ENC supports local community awareness of international education, culture, and business.

Great Decisions

A Foreign Policy Association lecture series by academic and professional experts. The lectures deal with issue specific topics such as energy, human rights, and health and with regional specific issues such as famine in Africa.

The Great Decisions program has been conducted for over 50 years and continues to expand as new councils are incorporated. This fee-based series of lectures run from mid-January through mid-March.

Each lecture includes a Q&A session with the speaker and an opportunity for participants to 'vote' for or against certain foreign policy positions of the U.S. government. Each year, the FPA consolidates the results of the voting and presents them to the Secretary of State.

Informal Chats on Global Issues

Monthly informal chats on global issues led by East Carolina faculty members at the Topsy Teapot in Uptown Greenville. Chats typically start at 6:30. Participants include ECU students, staff and faculty as well as members of the community. Discussion is lively. Past topics have included genocide and US-Iran relations.

Guest Speakers

Occasional presentations by guest speakers on a variety of topics related to global issues. For example, Dr. Aslam Khaki, Fulbright Scholar from the Muslim World, made a series of presentations throughout Greenville and spoke at the WAC-ENC annual meeting.
